As a professional organisation CCAS recognises that we have responsibilities in contributing to the preservation and enhancement of the environment whenever possible. This awareness involves both the management and operation of our own business as well as the advice we give to our clients in the course of carrying out our professional services in the construction and property related industries.

The area where this policy is affected is principally in advising on construction safety and its impact on the environment. In particular CCAS will:

- Comply with all legal requirements and all relevant British and European standards.
- Avoid the use of inherently non-recyclable materials wherever possible and encourage the use of recycled materials.
- Promote the consideration of energy efficient and sustainable design by way of life-cycle costing, cost-in-use studies and detailed evaluation of renewable energy services and design.
- Conduct our own activities in accordance with the CCAS Health & Safety Policy and take active participation in ensuring compliance with relevant statutory regulations when reviewing designs and construction procedures.
- Advise designers upon the inadvertent specification of environmentally undesirable products e.g. asbestos products, polyisocyanurate foam, etc.
- Encourage designers to specify hardwoods only when written evidence is required to be provided by a supplier that the wood is from sustainably managed forests.
- Ensure that contract documents contain relevant clauses dealing with adherence to the Control of Substances Hazardous to Health Regulations (2002), the Control of Asbestos at Work Regulations (2012), Environmental Protection Act (1990) and other relevant statutory instruments where appropriate.
